



Provider Access Statement (Baker Clause)

As of January 2018, all schools are required by law to publish how providers can access pupils to talk about technical education and apprenticeships per Section 42B of the Education Act:

Below are the details of how providers can request access, the rules governing how the academy can grant access and what providers can expect once access is granted. It also gives a brief outline of the opportunities that are available for years 8 to 11.

All pupils in years 8 to 11 are entitled to:

- Find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- Hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options events, assemblies, group discussions and taster events.
- Understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.
