Dining Hall



Food Technology

We are excited to announce that our has now been fully installed and ready for use when pupils return after the break. With eight pupil stations and a demonstration station we are really pleased with the outcome, and our pupils are already eager to make the most of the new space. As a practice run in the space our year 9 pupils have participated in the Future Chef competition, where they had to create a dish with a £5 budget to create their best dish. The winner will have the opportunity to represent Denewood Academy in the local and potentially the regional and national final, more on this later in the newsletter.



Curriculum update



To add further breadth to our curriculum at Denewood Academy we have also developed our curriculum to continue to inspire our pupils to enjoy learning.

English Curriculum

Since September, we began with a new English curriculum across the school. The curriculum programme named 'CUSP', has been developed to inspire, captivate imagination and creativity whilst building the essential skills and knowledge essential to succeed in English and in the wider world. There is an emphasis on oracy and vocabulary acquisition, revisiting concepts supports pupil retention and helps to break down barriers. Our pupils' fluency and comprehension of reading is developed throughout whilst encouraging pupils' pleasure for reading.

Pupils in Key Stage 3 are currently reading novels including 'The Graveyard Book' and 'Show Us Who You Are'. Pupils in Key Stage 2 are reading novels including 'Pig Heart Boy' and 'The Raven'. Pupils are also encouraged to read independently at times throughout the day to promote a love of reading. The pupils have been really engaged this term so far and we would like to say a big well done to all!








Creative Arts

We are thrilled to share the exciting developments in the new Creative Arts curriculum this year at Denewood Academy. This half term, our pupils have been introduced to 'Warhammer', which has brought a unique and engaging dimension to our arts program. At Denewood we use a reward system called DOJO.

Building a brighter future.


