Curriculum

This term, KS2 delved into the theme 'Invasion History'. This included lessons on Anglo Saxon Poetry, Arts & crafts, various foods and looking at an interconnected world. The topics were based upon the termly theme. Pupils also had the opportunity to go swimming visit The National Space Centre and attend bike maintenance sessions.

In KS3 we looked at aspirational stories in English. We also worked on our comprehension, spelling and grammar skills. In Maths, we re-enforced basic numeracy skills including factors and prime numbers. In Science, we learnt about cells and organisation as well developing our practical scientific skills. We focussed on E-Safety during Computing and understanding where technology came from. In PSHE, we celebrated who we are and our differences. We investigated formal elements in Art and looked at WW2 in History. We also developed some new skills through climbing and massage lessons.

Pupils also had chance to visit the Ben Kinsella exhibition, experience a drone flying workshop and enjoy a trip to the pantomime.
