# Personal Development

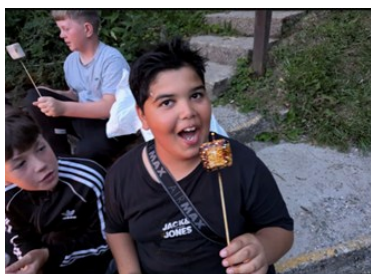
## Residential Trip: Adventure, Teamwork, and Lifelong Memories

It was fantastic to see our pupils so engaged, asking thoughtful questions and embracing every opportunity to connect with nature.



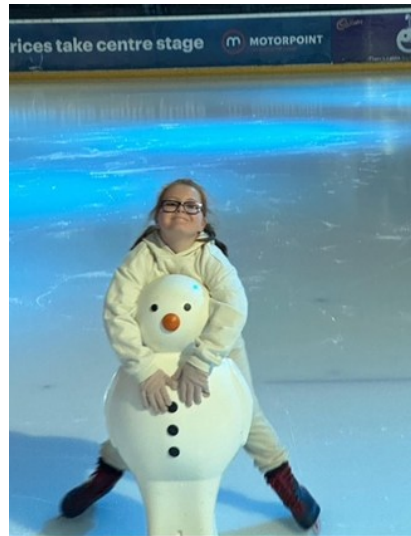
# Enrichment

## Denewood Academy Reward Shop & Dojo System Update

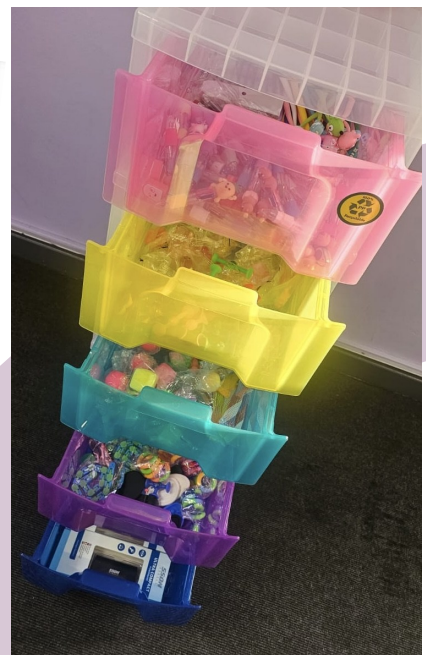
We've listened to our pupils about what motivates them, and they expressed a strong interest in a reward shop. In response, we have revamped how we use **Dojo points system** to encourage attendance and engagement.

Pupils now earn points in every lesson—each session is a fresh start. Points can be spent weekly in our reward shop or saved for higher-value items at the end of the term. Points are awarded for attendance, uniform, social skills, and demonstrating the school's **5C's**.

Dojo remains the platform for tracking progress, allowing parents and carers to view achievements in real time. Prizes range from 30 to 600 points, including toys, fidgets, stationery, footballs, power banks, speakers, vouchers, and more.

Every Friday, pupils can redeem points or save for bigger rewards, helping them develop valuable decision-making skills.
